Our Mission:

The Welcoming Streets is designed to support BIA businesses and vulnerable individuals simultaneously by addressing business concerns and providing direct systems navigation support.

Program Goals:

- 1. To establish & foster positive relationships
- 2. To support with systems navigation & connection to services
- 3. Community education and prevention planning
- 4. Offer de-escalation support
- 5. To enhance community safety

Expected Outcomes and Impact:

- 1. Stronger engagement between businesses and the community service sector
- 2. Deeper understanding of mental health and addictions and the types of support services available
- 3. Raised awareness, leading to an increase in more positive interactions and improved relationships between business owners and vulnerable population
- 4. Stronger connections and rapport building, leading to increased access to support services

In supporting individuals experiencing homelessness though direct outreach, individuals may access services faster. This immediacy results in:

- An understanding of various referral processes & appointment facilitation between client and service
- Client advocacy, person-centered care, and acknowledgement of lived and living experiences
- · Positive and empathetic interactions between business and individual
- The development of meaningful trusting relationships
- Reduction in calls to local police department & a proactive approach to supporting others
- Reduction in potentially violent situations
- Stronger sense of community and inclusivity
- Community partnerships (business community and social service sector)
- · Cohesive approach and a reduction in the duplication of services provided
